- 3 yr old project

Val brought forward a letter of concern and discussion followed.

Policy 6.05

Add under Project animals.

- Project must be identified when project declared with a 4-H Tag, or Tatoo, or CCIA (RFID) number.
- -Two year old Cow/calf is Continuation of Heifer project
- Three year old Cow/calf is continuation of 2yr old Cow/calf project.

Add to definition of 2 and 3yr old projects.

- 2 yr old record book must have a completed record book to continue on as a 3 yr old.

Wording change - All project animals with horns exceeding 2 inches from hairline are prohibited.

Market Beef Clarification

- Has market beef project – Creative Options – for Jack pot class.

Dorothy makes the motion to accept all above changes to policy 6.05 as presented. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Ed. Carried Stacy said she would put the policy in a more defined order for final print.
