The TD 4-H Agriculture Scholarships are open to all active 4-H members over the age of 16. Applicants with the highest academic average in their province are selected as recipients. “The agricultural industry, as many of us know, is evolving and providing new ways for young

people to enter the field,” Shaw continued. “Opportunities such as this scholarship encourage youth to consider the field of study, and provide a means to do so.”

4-H is one of Canada’s longest running youth organizations. Since 1913, 4-H youth have pledged their Head, Heart, Hands and Health to their 4-H club, their community, and their country.
