

## **ARRIVAL / DEPARTURE – Barrhead AGBARN, AGRENA and Surrounding Grounds**

Project arrival and livestock admitted: Thursday, July 7<sup>th</sup>, 4:00 pm to 9:30 pm; Friday, Saturday and Sunday, July 8-10<sup>th</sup> 7:00 am to 8:30 am. Life Skills Bench Show projects accepted 10:00 am -10:30 am Saturday, July 9<sup>th</sup>. Projects released at end of the beef show on Saturday, July 9<sup>th</sup> and after classes and clean up of horse and canine shows Sunday, July 10<sup>th</sup>.

- ◆ All club/group leaders are asked to check in at the Registration Desk upon arrival.
- ◆ Collect your club information package and hand in your silent auction items (minimum one per club).

### **STABLING**

- ◆ Horses will be stabled in the AGRENA or in designated areas by trailers on the AG Society grounds.
- ◆ Beef, Goats and Sheep will be stabled in assigned areas in AGRENA or in pens on the AG Society grounds;
- ◆ Unloading of livestock permitted only at designated locations. Check the site map for parking or livestock trailers.

### **FEED AND BEDDING**

Buy bagged feed from local feed companies. Bedding (shavings) may be available.

### **ACCOMMODATIONS**

Accommodations while attending Focus on 4-H are the responsibility of the participants. Enclosed with the package is a list of alternative accommodation.

**Overnight Sites** available on the grounds for \$10.00 for the duration of the program. Fee applies to all units used for accommodation and parked in the overnight areas. This charge is due May 15<sup>th</sup> with registration fees. No hook-ups available. Clubs will be assigned sites so families from a 4-H club can camp together, and for horse stalling.

4-H members are expected to keep their overnight areas clean. Please record the length of all your units on enclosed form. Members and families please note: You are considered to be on a 4-H program site, and 4-H rules and policies will apply. To be specific, this means that alcohol and tobacco use are not permitted on the program site.

### **MEALS**

Included in the member registration fee: Saturday evening meal, Sunday noon meal, three breakfasts, and a Friday evening hot dog snack. All other meals are the participant's responsibility. Concession will be open during the day. Adults and family members may purchase meal tickets in advance (\$20/day or \$35 for all meals).

### **LIABILITY**

All exhibits shall be under the control and direction of Focus on 4-H and facilities owners and operators, but solely at the risk of the exhibitor. Focus on 4-H will not be responsible for damage, injury, loss or theft. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage done to, occasioned by or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by the exhibitor and for its description as given in the catalogue, and shall indemnify Focus on 4-H and facility owners and community boards against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted nor suit instituted or maintained against facility owners and operating boards, its officers or agents, by or on behalf of any visitor, or any person, firm or corporation or their agents, representatives or employees, having license or privilege to exhibit in the area or occupying any space thereon. Designated 4-H Leaders are assigned to attend to the safe care of 4-H members during the shows.
