

Northwest 4-H Scholarships

The Northwest 4-H Regional Council offers scholarships for post-secondary students. A committee selected by the Northwest 4-H Regional Council chooses the recipients of the Northwest 4-H Scholarship, the Northwest 4-H Safety Scholarships and the A.P. (Tony) Lefebvre Memorial Northwest Scholarship.

Northwest 4-H Scholarship

- ◆ Present or past 4-H member from Northwest Region for at least 3 years
 - ◆ Any course of study in a recognized post-secondary educational institution
 - ◆ Second year of study or beyond
 - ◆ Value: \$500
 - ◆ Completed essay of 750 – 1000 words on the following topic:
“Using the 4-H Pledge and the 4-H Motto, write an essay on how you have fulfilled your pledge to the 4-H Program and to yourself.”
- This scholarship was first offered in 2003.

Northwest 4-H Safety Scholarships

- ◆ Three scholarships
 - ◆ Present or past 4-H members from the Northwest Region for a minimum of 3 years
 - ◆ Second year of study or beyond
 - ◆ Any course of study at a recognized post-secondary educational institution
 - ◆ Value: \$500, \$400 and \$400
 - ◆ Complete essay of 500 to 750 words on a topic related to **safety**.
- These scholarships were first offered in 2001.

A.P. (Tony) Lefebvre Memorial Northwest Scholarship

- ◆ Present or past 4-H members from the Northwest Region for a minimum of 3 years, and who have taken an animal project in 4-H
 - ◆ Second year of study or beyond
 - ◆ Animal related or business related course of study at a recognized post-secondary educational institution preferred. Others considered.
 - ◆ Value: \$500
 - ◆ Complete essay of 500 to 750 words on a topic related to **animal care**.
- This Scholarship was offered for the first time in 2007.

Application Process:

Student applies through the Provincial 4-H Scholarship process by May 5th. Applicant may receive a specific Northwest scholarship one time only. An applicant may receive a Northwest regional scholarship in addition to any provincial 4-H scholarship awarded in the same year.
