Sample Interview Questions

Three phases of a successful interview:

- 1. **Establish rapport** by welcoming them. Consider offering a glass of water, coffee or tea. Engage in small talk (e.g. talk about last night's game) to get the conversation started.
- 2. **Exchange of information**. Most of the time in the interview is spent with you asking a number of questions to see how well the person is suited for the job and working with your company. Review the 35 sample questions below and ask a **minimum of six** of the following questions. Include at least one question from each section: work, education, personal.
- 3. **Wrap-up** the conversation by asking the candidate if they have any final questions, let them know what the next step of your hiring process is, when they can expect to hear back from you, and thank them for their interest in the job.

Education Questions (Cover: primary, secondary, college and university, specialized training and recent courses)	I will ask this question

Personal Factors Questions (Things to look for: insights on character, personality and overall attitude)	I will ask this question

23. Tell me about your hobbies and interests.	
24. What do you consider a good day's effort?	
25. What special characteristics should I consider about you as a person?	
26. Give me an example of your initiative in a challenging situation.

30. What kinds of decisions are most difficult for you?
