How to Submit Papers

- Papers must be submitted online through the website: <http://www.editorialmanager.com/euph/>
- If you are a new author to *Euphytica* please click the “Register” button from the menu bar and enter the requested information.
- After registering, you will get your user name and password to enable you to login under “Author Login” and submit your paper.
- Read and follow Instructions to Authors to tailor your paper(s).
- At the top of the first page of your manuscript and abstract you must indicate that your manuscript is for a Special Issue by indicating “**SI: ISPHSC**”. This way your article will go directly to guest editors for the Special Issue.
- *Euphytica* created the Special Issue article type “**SI: ISPHSC**” to ensure that articles of the 12th ISPHSC do not end up in the general pool. Authors can start to submit their manuscripts under this special issue article type immediately.
