# History of the Alberta SPCA

- Formed in 1959 by individuals who recognized a growing need for provincial legislation in rural Alberta
- Board and staff advocated and assisted on the formation of the Animal Protection Act which was proclaimed in 1967
- Received its first ever grant in 1968 from the provincial government enabling the agency to enforce the new law



### **Alberta SPCA**

- Not All SPCAs are created alike
- Model is different in each Province
- In Alberta, all SPCAs and Humane Societies are independently operated




# **Alberta SPCA**

- Board of Directors max 9 members
- Current board membership made up from those in both rural and urban communities
- Producer, veterinarians, teacher, small animal rescues and those with experience in board governance
- Board is very mindful of their responsibility to ensure recruitment of those with animal welfare vs those with animal rights agenda

# **The Alberta Protection Act**

- Gives our Peace Officers legal authority to attend on private land if he/she believes there is an animal in distress.
- Gives our Peace Officers the legal authority to relieve distress including taking custody of the animal(s) and/or euthanizing or having the animal euthanized.



# **Definition of Distress**

For the purposes of this Act, an animal is in Distress if it is:

- (a) deprived of adequate shelter, ventilation, space, food, water or veterinary care or reasonable protection from injurious heat or cold,
- (b) injured, sick, in pain or suffering, or
  - (c) abused or subjected to undue hardship, privation or neglect.



# **Peace Officers/Investigators**

- Alberta SPCA is an authorized employer of Peace Officers.
- Legislation governing peace officers is found in the *Peace Officer Act*, the Peace Officer Regulation and the Peace Officer (Ministerial) Regulation.
- Our peace officers are given specific powers and authorities, under the current Alberta *Peace Officer Act* (May, 2007).



### **Peace Officers/Investigators**

 Alberta Justice and Solicitor General has overall authority for the Peace Officer Program, and it is administered by the Public Security Division under the Assistant Deputy Minister/Director of Law Enforcement.




# Investigations

#### Complaint driven

- Typically receive from a member of the public, or
- Other agencies such as ARD, AFAC, SPCA/Humane Societies, and RCMP/Municipal Police
- Goal is to ensure animals are not in distress
- Situations vary considerably
- Response of our Peace Officer depends on severity of the situation





# **APS – Philosophy**

The goal of the Alberta SPCA's Animal Protection Services Philosophy is for all animal owners to demonstrate compliance.



# **APS – Philosophy cont.**

#### Basic Principles:

- Compliance is facilitated through a good understanding of the purpose and rationale of the specific requirements of any legislation or standard.
- 2. A severity of distress-based approach to compliance will be used.
- 3. Compliance tools will be deployed in a logical sequence of steps, with the starting point and speed of progression based on severity of distress.
- 4. The approach to compliance will take into account the animal owner's/caretaker's previous record of compliance, or beyond compliance, behaviour.



# **APS – Philosophy cont.**

- 5. The Alberta SPCA has an obligation to assess overall compliance and will use monitoring activities as appropriate for the distress associated with the specific circumstances.
- 6. Responding to public complaints is part of the Alberta SPCA's Animal Protection Services Program. Each complaint will be assessed and where the Alberta SPCA has a role, investigated, and the appropriate action taken to resolve the complaint. Complainants will be advised upon resolution of the investigation.
- 7. Prosecution is a tool of compliance not a goal.
- 8. Prosecution will be evidence-based, following a documented investigation and adjudicated by the courts.

# Alberta SPCA & the Role of the Veterinarian

- For general advice.
- To provide training for our Peace Officers.



# Role of the Veterinarian cont'd

- As part of the investigation process:
  - If an animal(s) appears to be in distress, our Peace Officer will have the owner call his/her veterinarian for a diagnosis and recommended treatment.
  - If our Peace Officer determines a search warrant is necessary, then he/she will call a veterinarian to attend to provide expert advise regarding the condition of the animal(s).



# Role of the Veterinarian cont'd

- At any point in an investigation euthanasia of compromised animals may be required
- Where possible veterinarians will euthanize a compromised animal(s)



# Role of the Veterinarian cont'd

 Should charges be laid, a veterinarian may be called to provide expert testimony regarding the condition of the animal(s).
