## **Purpose**

To clearly outline the standards and specifications for submission of final cutblock boundaries to Alberta.

# **Policy Context**

Spatial data submissions are required to allow Alberta to more accurately monitor and report on the following key attributes:

- i. total area (hectares) harvested;
- ii. the location and number of openings created.

This directive applies to operators harvesting greater than 10,000 cubic metres of timber annually from public land.

#### **Procedure**

Final spatial cutblock data submissions must meet the standards and specifications outlined in the document <u>Disturbance Updates – Standards and Specifications for Timber Harvesting, incorporated as Chapter 4 of the Alberta Vegetation Inventory Standards and Data Model Documents (Version 3.1, November 2015).</u>

All final cutblock boundaries must be submitted on May 15<sup>th</sup> within two (2) years from the reforestation clock start date or as agreed to, in writing, by the Executive Director, Forest Management Branch.

### **Spatial Data**

Spatial data must be submitted in accordance with the standards and specifications outlined in AF, Forestry Policy, 2015, No. 1.

#### **Feature Attributes**

The following feature attributes must be submitted for every cutblock:

- Disposition holder (i.e. company or agency)
- Authority to harvest (i.e. disposition)
- ARIS opening number
- Harvest code (i.e. Harvested, Merchantable Residual Retention, Non-merchantable Residual Retention, Anthropogenic disturbance, Naturally non-vegetated)
- Year of harvest (i.e. timber year May 1<sup>st</sup> to April 30<sup>th</sup>).

#### **Submissions**

Submissions must be validated as per Annex 2 of the Forest Management Planning Standard.

All data submissions must be made to the Director, Forest Resource Analysis Section, Forest Management Branch, Forestry Division, Agriculture and Forestry.
