Feedlot Beef Production

If you are taking one of the Alberta 4-H beef steer projects you can also earn significant high school credits. The career pathway already exists through the green certificate program in most schools.

To summarize the program, participants receive a training curriculum representing the skills needed to obtain the Green Certificate. The trainee receives most of his or her training through apprenticeship-like, on-the-job training under a competent trainer-farmer.
