Realities of Spreading Manure on Snow and Frozen Land

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What AOPA Says

AOPA allows the spreading of manure on snow and frozen ground **under certain conditions**.

Operations that have manure storage for 9 months or utilize short term manure storage (for solid manure) have two options:

1. request permission from the NRCB

2. or Board publishes a notice for a geographical area



What AOPA Says

All operations must:

1. Meet setbacks for residences and common body of water.

2. Must not pose a risk to the environment



Benefits of the Regulations

Asking for permission

- Demonstrates that producers are aware of the environmental risks
- Ensures that practice is managing those risks



Industry Realties





Shortage of Manure Storage

- Weather conditions
- Early snow fall, late spring snow cover and frost conditions that limit ability to get on land.
- Availability of custom applicators
- Liquid manure storage capacity



Winter Pen Management

- Improve animal health and productivity
- Excess snow build up impact on feed bunk area and waterer area.
- Reduce excess moisture in spring





Increased Environmental Risk






Most Runoff in the Prairies Occurs During Snowmelt

>90% of annual runoff, averaged across 8 watersheds in Alberta (Little et al. 2007)

Up to 76% of annual runoff for Crowfoot Creek, Southern Alberta (Ontkean & Chanasyk 2005)




Rainfall Runoff Events
