

Contest Ideas for 4-H Canada's 100th Anniversary

4-H trivia contest: 4-H trivia quiz that community member and 4-Hers can participate in and submit to be eligible for a prize draw. The quiz could be published in the local newspaper or 4-H publication with a deadline for entries to be submitted by. All correct entries could then go into a prize draw for a 4-H prize, i.e. set of 4-H cookbooks, 4-H duffle bag, 4-H belt buckle or a prize deemed appropriate by the local organizers **(Trivia questions attached)**

4-H centennial theme song: 4-Hers could write a song for 4-H Canada's 100th and this could be used as a warm up for 4-H Alberta's 100th.

4-H poster contest: 4-Hers could design a cover page for the Alberta 4-H magazine to commemorate 4-H Canada turning 100. The Alberta 4-H magazine would select the winner and use the "poster" on an edition of the magazine. The winner would be awarded a commemorative centennial item/

4-H coloring contest for Cleaver Kids: Districts could run the contest in their district and award the winner a prize. **(Coloring contest picture attached)**

Photos: Collect or take photos of 100 4-H members (past or current members) **be creative.** The photos could be displayed at Achievement Day and/or other 4-H events during 2013/

T-Shirts: Design and make a 100th t-shirt to wear at your meetings and special events this year.

Activity: Create your own activity to recognize the 100th.

Challenge: Go 100 hours without electricity/cell phone/texting/computers. Meet the challenge and join in a 100th fun activity.

Collect: Have your Club collect 100 items for donation (canned goods, socks, books, etc.) for your local food bank.
