Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: Can any 4-H member participate?

A: This is an open competition for all 4-H Alberta members. There is no need to qualify. There will be junior, intermediate and senior categories. Speeches for juniors and intermediates must be 3-5 minutes, whereas seniors will be 4-6 minutes.

Q: Is there a cost for participating?
