

**Minutes of the

**Regional Reports (Condensed)**

*WEST CENTRAL*- celebrated 25 years at Regionals. 205 members/17 clubs/ 245 horses/190 classes. Day 1 - Showmanship and English, Day 2 - Young Horse & Western & Day 3 - Fun Day

*PEACE*- #s dropping drastically. 2 Reg. shows -Bench, Crafts and Fun (cancelled by low interest) and Horse & Heifer Show - Aside from regular classes, had Showmanship Swap class - members had 5 minutes to teach each other how to show the other species, then judged.

*SOUTH*- Summer camp involvement sparked interest in 4-Hers who were thinking of leaving. Elkwater camp held despite bad weather. Regionals -120 entries, lots of Level 2,3&4, but down in 5/6 and some accidents. English interest growing. Issue of members attending functions while still indebted from prior events won't be able to compete. Cactus Country Rodeo, Medicine Hat (Aug) had only 20 and steer riding was cancelled. South kids enjoyed Horse Classic. Regional record book competition again. Requests for Ring and Tack Steward Clinic (possible instructor - Richard Smith from BC - contact Ginny).

*CALGARY*- 4-H on Parade - 8-900 members/1000 projects/150 horses. Regionals - 180 riders, LOTS of new riders (85 Level 1&2) Jess Hartung, leader, instructed Showmanship & Patterns Clinic 1<sup>st</sup> night - Good! Provincial Rodeo next weekend. Working new Stampede Casino -Feb.

*NORTHWEST* - Focus on 4-H early July, numbers down. At Northlands had 212, but cost \$70-80,000, now at Mayerthorpe, \$2500 - had 84 members (72 last year). Hard to get leaders to COMMIT to clinics. Had Dave Elliott Bit clinic and offered free to ALL members and leaders - only attended by Ken's club. Another planned for April.

\*\*\*\*Ken brought forth the concern that when consumers go to purchase a bit at a tack store (eg. Lammles), they are often given the incorrect information, due to the salesperson's lack of knowledge - needs to be addressed.\*\*\*

*EAST CENTRAL*- 22 at Regionals, but horse members down. 3 Rodeo Circuit still strong (75?).

\*\*Observations from Regional Reports – 4-H NATIONALLY is declining. Discussion held regarding starting kids younger. Also New Focus needed - How to attract members AND leaders and get them to commit to clinics and learning????

### **Young Horse Incentive Program**

Suggestions - Record Book figures for feeds, etc. are unrealistic - get Club leaders more involved by marking at club level (not faxed in as now) - will also take pressure off YHIP committee. Circulate (to leaders) information regarding achievement day expectations and perhaps develop quarterly assessments to be checked off, ensuring progress. Have information day early in the year (especially for weanlings). Members and leaders need more information regarding nutrition, health, and handling. Also, need dates set a year beginning, so they commit. Suggestion - form a YHIP Facebook?? Jodee and MaryLou join the YHIP committee of Larry, Beth, Kym Lawrence and Shirley Woods(?). Provincial clinic needed!!

### **Standardbred Project**

Achievement Day is Thanksgiving in Edmonton. Do Standardbreds have to have Level 3 MOUNTED??

Dixie/Kippy **moved and seconded** "Members wishing to enroll in non-mounted projects are not required to complete Level 1, 2 or 3 Mounted Assessments, but it is mandatory that they have completed the Dismounted Assessments in Horsemanship Levels 1, 2 and 3".

Discussion noted that non-mounted projects are those such as Draft, Standardbred, Miniatures and Driving. Carried.

### **Horse Classic**

Entries down - 76 members and 49 adult volunteers. All Denver delegates are from West Central. Cancelled illustrated talks. Trouble finding horses for Judging. Judged same 4 horses in Halter, Showmanship and Pleasure. Suggested check AEF contact list for horses close to Olds. REMINDER (for the records) \*In HC Judging, all horses are to be considered SOUND.\* Suggested to ADVERTISE clinics. Clinic topics needed - Ruth Fowler, Drill Teams suggested. Kippy has contacts for Vaulting, Dressage and Endurance - will forward to Ashley.

### **AEF Report**

New AEF website (Search bar, Event Calendar, News, Forms/Site Registration) - contains information on all items below. Address remains [www.albertaequestrian.com](http://www.albertaequestrian.com).

AEF has teamed with AVMA, AFAC, SPCA and Horse Industry to form the "Horse Welfare Alliance of Canada" to ensure a high standard of welfare for the horse and provide a unified voice across Canada. AEF's Chair, Dixie Crowson has been nominated to represent Alberta as the Spokesperson Trainee for Horse Welfare (seminar in Regina Sept 11/12). Booklet available to all "Humane Handling Guidelines for Horses" - contact AEF, AFAC or Horse Industry.

Casino Funding - is doubled. Groups are eligible for up to \$1000 and Individuals for \$500 IF they have worked at an AEF event (trade shows, casinos, etc). If not, amounts are ½. Individuals applying must be members and groups must at least be affiliate members (like 4-H).

Bio-Security - continues to be an ongoing concern to limit the spread of illness. Take precautions and care when transporting horses to and from events.

Animal Health Technologists Conference - Sept. 19-21 at Capri, Red Deer - \$375. Topics include mare and foal programs, equine respiratory disease, horse acupuncture and chiropractic.

*VIDEO* was one priority. Update - VERY close to distribution (within month??). 1375 copies for across Canada, goes first to Sponsors, Riders, PEAC members and one per Alberta Club (along with laminated copy of Assessments). Remainder of CD s will NOT be sold, as some funding was acquired through grant.

Budget was over, (just under \$37,000). Reproduction costs will be covered by Canadian Council - \$11 per set (4 discs). Disc 1 - Groundwork and Arena Etiquette and Discs 2,3 & 4 - Levels 1-6. Revisions to Level Assessments will be added to the posters and also posted on the website.

*PROMOTION* - The 4-H magazine remains our major source of distribution of information. Deadlines are February 27, July 27 and October 24. PEAC rep is still needed - Linda offered to try. Also hope to team with AEF for promotion.

#### **Road Trip**

Yvonne explored 2 options - Chilliwack and Spokane, both \$150 per person. \*\* Noted that Spokane would need a passport.

Kippy/Mary Lou **moved and seconded** that a road trip be taken to Spokane. Carried. Yvonne will make arrangements. Reply deadline is March 15<sup>th</sup> to Yvonne (intent and money, with cheque payable to the Alberta 4-H Foundation included).

Minimum of 10 spots available, depending on the vehicle. First priority given to the 2 Elected Reps from each region, positions of Chair, Secretary, Past Chair, Provincial Council and AEF Reps and Regional Alternates. If there are spaces left over, then it will be opened up to others. Jodee will check with High Prairie Coach lines (approx. \$1.10 per km.)

## **Provincial Clinics**

Financial allowance available for up to 3 Provincial Clinics per year. Definitely is a need for another Assessment Clinic and also a Young Horse Clinic.

*Young Horse* (Proposed details) -

Intent - Leader Training - learning how to help members with Young Horse Projects

NOVEMBER 22 & 23 - Saturday and Sunday to early afternoon

PARTICIPANTS - all leaders, YHIP participants with yearlings in '07/8 program to be asked to bring horses, new registrants in "08/9 strongly encouraged to attend (with horses???), parents and interested spectators

LOCATION - must include arena (heated), roundpen, stabling and accommodation (reasonably close). MaryLou will check out Olds, Jimilee - Stettler and Dixie - Delburne

INSTRUCTORS suggested - Ken (handling), Dr. Larry Frischke (health and vaccinations), Olds College Farriers (hoof care - handling and trimming), Olds College Instructor attending PELF (nutrition), Beth & Lee?? - (record books).

Details (including above, as well as cost to participants and spectators) are to be in to Yvonne by September 19<sup>th</sup> !!!

*TNT Evaluation Assessments Clinic* - Muffy's available dates - October 25/6, or November 1/2, or November 15/16. One of these to replace the East Central Regional TnT she has had to cancel twice. Discussion - fall is too rushed to get info out, have to push for her show schedule to see when she is available in spring.

The PELF weekend in February is MOST suitable, (or March). Agreement that we pursue a Prov. Assessment Clinic with Muffy Knox in early spring of 2009. Details to be decided.

\*Regional Assessment Clinic for EC is tentatively planned for Nov 15/16 (pending arrangements)\*.

## **Tack Guidelines**

#### **4-H Application to AEF for Funding**

Extensive discussion regarding the request of AEF Casino Funding by 4-H organizations. Consensus was that the activity should be of an educational nature.

Lee/ Jodee **moved and seconded** the following policy - "Each region must work an AEF activity (or designate someone on their behalf) in order to apply for funding for their proposed activity. Funding should be applied for through their Region, and then passed on to the AEF with the region's recommendations. Maximum funding will be decided by AEF." Carried.

#### **New Business**

##### *4-H/Pony Club/Polocrosse Alberta Equestrian Summer Games*

Is there enough interest to host in August of 2009? Proposed location would likely be Central Alberta. Reps to take back to regions and reply at next meeting. If interested, need volunteers to make it a success.

##### *Horse Slaughter*

Dixie reported that slaughter opponents (activists) are working on a bill to shut down slaughter in Canada, as was done in US. Reps are to take issue back to their regions and find out - "What 4-H adults opinion is on the slaughter?????" and make sure they are informed.
