

Eight 4-H Volunteers Recognized with Annual Award

Co-operators Volunteer Leader of the Year Award recognizes the efforts of 4-H volunteers across Canada

OTTAWA, March 3, 2010- The Canadian 4-H Council today announced eight recipients of the 2009 Co-operators/4-H National Volunteer Leader of the Year Award, representing eight of the ten provinces across Canada.

Each winner received a \$100 gift, as well as Co-operators and 4-H products. In addition, one volunteer will be recognized as the grand prize winner with a \$1,000 prize, and receive a trip to the 4-H Annual Conference and General Meeting held in Ottawa in May, 2010.

"The National Volunteer Leader of the Year Award is a fantastic way to recognize the contributions of 4-H leaders in Canada," said Judy Shaw, president of the Canadian 4-H Council. "Without the time and efforts of our more than 8,500 volunteers, 4-H would not be the strong and vibrant program that it is today."

Collectively, the selected volunteers have close to 200 years of active involvement in 4-H.

Each winner was nominated by their respective 4-H members, who are asked to give examples on how their leader has made their community a better place, and why they deserve the Co-operators/4-H National Volunteer Leader of the Year Award.

"The commonality throughout all of the nominations was an extreme devotion to the 4-H program and to the 4-H Members," Shaw continued. "This is consistent across the country, and we owe a tremendous amount of gratitude to 4-H volunteers throughout Canada."

Volunteers are recognized annually by the Co-operators and the Canadian 4-H Council. Generally, one volunteer is selected from each province, with a grand prize winner selected from the group.

"As an organization that encourages and supports volunteerism, we are proud to recognize the significant contributions of this year's recipients," said Kathy Bardswick, president and CEO of The Co-operators. "What volunteers know is this: the gift is two-fold – the person volunteering often receives as much as those being helped. Congratulations to 4-H for a long history of instilling these values."

Pierre Marcoux of St. Ferdinand, Quebec, was selected as the \$1,000 grand prize winner for the award, in recognition of his more than 25 years of volunteering with 4-H.

His club said that he plays a significant role in encouraging and mentoring the 4-H Members in his club. In addition, Marcoux helps out in any way he can during club activities, and he works hard to promote the 4-H program in the area.
