Everyone Attends: Moving Emergency Services from Talk to Action: Olds Emergency Services will demonstrate the ripple effect of a farm injury incident.

Fire Extinguisher Training: A combination of classroom and practical application of fire extinguisher safety. Participants receive certification.

Power Line Safety: Power line touches continue at an increasing rate as farm machinery gets bigger. Fortis Alberta will share many stories about the weird and wonderful world of power line touches (also looks at underground line safety).

Farm Hazard Assessment: The number one tool in making your farm safer is a hazard assessment. Learn how to properly assess your farm for safety.

Rural Roads, Staying Safe as a Young Driver: Office of Traffic Safety, Alberta Health Services and Department of Transportation will share their experiences around seatbelts, rollovers, rural roads, large loads and young drivers. Buckle Up!

Passport to Safety: On computers, you will access this online young worker training course. Certification provided. Requires access to a computer after the workshop to complete the course.

Farm Safety for Hutterite Colonies: A comprehensive look at how colony students can make their farms safer.

Farm Safety Visit for Green Certificate School Coordinators & Trainers: Required to attend the half day workshop (morning) on completing the farm safety visit.. The afternoon is free to attend another session.

Afternoon Sessions: (3 Hours)

Emergency CPR – Adult: Red Cross Certification in CPR

Large Animal Safety: A combination of classroom and practical application of handling large livestock (excluding equine). *BRING RUBBER BOOTS, GLOVES AND COVERALLS*

ATV/Quad Safety Training: Through classroom and demonstrations increase your knowledge of ATV/Quad safety. Learn the limitations of a quad for farm applications.

Equine Safety: If you are a horse lover, take this session to explore all the safe ways to handle your animals. *BRING RUBBER BOOTS, GLOVES AND COVERALLS*

Tractor Rollover/Bale Handling: Classroom and practical approach to tractor and bale handling safety techniques. Prevent the number one cause of farm fatalities – tractor rollovers.

Chemical Safety on the Farm: Explore the labels of your farm chemicals and learn how to apply them properly. Handling, storing, mixing, applications, personal protective gear will all be covered.
