WATER WELL RESTORATION OR REPLACEMENT PROGRAM (WWRRP)

- 1. The Water Well Restoration or Replacement Program (WWRRP) is funded by the oil and gas industry through levies paid to the Alberta Energy Regulator (AER). This program allows a rural landowner an opportunity to have their private water source, which they believe was damaged by oil and gas related activities, to be considered for repair or replacement costs.
- 2. Before an application can be submitted under this program, the applicant must endeavour to contact the geophysical or oil company to attempt to obtain a settlement for the alleged damages.
- 3. If the applicant is unsuccessful with the company and believes the alleged damages were caused by:

The appropriate department may carry out an investigation and take the necessary action with a subsequent report to the WWRRP Committee.

- 4. This program is designed to make partial or full payment only on those direct costs that have been incurred with the restoration or replacement of a water well. Therefore, the applicant must include, all receipts for works completed with the application.
- 5. The applicant must be prepared to attend and present evidence at a WWRRP Committee hearing, which will be held near the applicant's location. The committee consists of a 3- member panel including a representative from the Farmers' Advocate Office, who acts as the Chairman, a member of the Agricultural Development Committee, and a technical representative from Alberta Environment and Sustainable Resource Development.
- 6. All payments awarded under this program are of a gratuitous nature and are not made under any legal obligation or statutory requirement. Consequently, the decisions following from this program are final and not subject to appeal.
- 7. Following the hearing, the committee will forward the results of their decision, if in the affirmative, to the AER for payment to the applicant. The applicant will be advised in writing of the committee's decision. The department that carried out the investigation will be notified of the outcome.
