One word describes Canadian hemp: opportunity. With numerous commercial advancements being made right here in Alberta, industrial hemp is a crop many have their eye on.

Hemp is a non-genetically modified crop that has been used for thousands of years to make paper, rope, clothing and food.

Canada is a global leader in hemp production and a large hemp product exporter. Canadian producers have gained extensive experience in growing this crop since the introduction of our Industrial Hemp Regulations in 1998.

Hemp is a sustainable resource, rapidly renewable due to its fast-growing nature. Shorter hemp varieties are often grown for seed, whereas the taller varieties, which can reach up to four metres, are most often grown for fibre — that's a lot of biomass in a growing season!

Hemp is lightweight, has high tensile strength and is very absorbent. It can be used in automotive products, construction materials or textiles and makes great erosion control and animal bedding among many other things.

As an effective, easily digested and absorbed food, hemp is also a good source of protein, fiber and essential fatty acids (omegas 3, 6, and 9). Hemp is an environmentally sustainable crop, requiring few chemicals and pesticides and naturally competes in displacing weeds.
