• The research committee dealt with most of the committee business on conference calls and by email with one face-to-face meeting with Dr. Ken Fry in November.	
• The committee recommended funding of two research projects this past year, which the STOPDED board subsequently approved.	
• The first project funded is entitled "Bionomics of banded elm bark beetles and implications for Dutch elm disease management in	
Saskatchewan and Manitoba with Dr. Neil Holliday, from the University of Manitoba as the principle researcher. STOPDED	
approved to fund this project in the amount of \$7500.00, \$3,750.00 for the 2010/2011 fiscal year and another 3750. 00 for the	
2011/2012 year. We received the project progress report last week. The report is available if anyone wishes to see it. The	
highlights are that BEBB was caught on sticky traps beginning in May with the peak flight in August.	
• The Second project was an in-house STOPDED project that was conducted by Nigel Seymour under contract. STOPDED spent	
\$10K to survey Counties and MD's that are high risk for Dutch Elm Disease. Nigel presented his results at the November general	
meeting in Edmonton. The study is available on-line if anyone wishes to see it. No DED suspect trees were detected although	
Nigel reported that many of the elm trees were in poor condition. This study also served to increase the profile of STOPDED in	

the counties that Nigel surveyed which was an excellent outcome.

• The last item is that the committee contacted the Edmonton Waste Management Centre of Excellence to obtain a report on the "Fate of Elm Diseases during Composting" study which STOPDED provided \$20K in total funding over two years. The final report dated January 2010 was received last week after our inquiry. The study reported that elm disease pathogens, Dotheriella and Verticillium was eradicated in compost piles where the temperature exceeded 40 C for more than 5.5 days. The committee chair reviewed the report and found no acknowledgement of the STOPDED funding and contacted the centre to tell them how important it was to STOPDED to have our contribution recognized. The centre agreed and stated that a factsheet for public distribution is currently being developed based on the study and STOPDED will be recognized on this.
