Purpose:

To advise landowners or occupants of the Agricultural Service Board's roadside vegetation, weed control protocol, and to provide by way of this agreement, a method of recording all land locations that will be exempt from chemical control.

Authority:

Weeds and invasive plants are regulated under the provincial *Weed Control Act*. Under the *Agricultural Service Board Act*, the Agricultural Service Board has the responsibility to advise, organize and direct weed control. Under Section 532 of the *Municipal Government Act*, Camrose County is required to maintain its roads in a reasonable state of repair or risk being held liable for any damages if found in non-compliance.

Definitions:

- "Landowner" means any person registered under the Land Titles Act as the owner, or a person who is in lawful possession of the property or who has the right to exercise control over the property.
- "Occupant" means any person occupying or exercising control or having the right to occupy or exercise control over the land.
- "Vegetation" means woody plant species, including shrubs and trees of all age classifications.

Policy Statements:

- 1. The Agricultural Fieldman will yearly, three (3) weeks before June 1, advertise in all local papers that spraying is about to begin, and those with objections should get in touch with the Agricultural Services office.
- 2. Those ratepayers who request spraying not be done on land adjacent to their property will complete the AGREEMENT FOR RESTRICTED_USE OF HERBICIDE FOR BRUSH AND WEED CONTROL IN SENSITIVE AREAS in the format as approved by the Agricultural Service Board.
- 3. It shall be the responsibility of the landowner or occupant to purchase, erect and maintain signs indicating that this is an environmentally sensitive area and spraying should not be done.
- 4. The Agricultural Services Office will have these signs available and they must be purchased through the Agricultural Service Board.

AGREEMENT FOR RESTRICTED USE OF HERBICIDE FOR BRUSH AND WEED CONTROL IN SENSITIVE AREAS

Camrose County Agricultural Service Board recognizes that certain landowners/tenants are not in favor of brush and weed spraying with herbicides within public road allowances and on other public lands bordering upon their property.

In light of requests by landowners/tenants that they would be interested in brush/weed control on public lands bordering upon their property, the following guidelines will be followed:

Camrose County Responsibilities and Program Guidelines

- To provide by way of this agreement, a method of recording all land locations that will be exempt from spraying.
- Recorded land locations will be observed by Camrose County spray crews as "Spraying Exempt Areas", but Camrose County will not be responsible for other vegetation control companies hired by outside sources (i.e. Trans Alta Utilities) spraying in these areas.
 - If inadequate control measures are taking place by the landowner/tenant, they will be contacted by the Agricultural Fieldman or Manager of Public Works to remind them of our agreement.
- Landowners/tenant will be given 10 working days to remedy the problem, and if control has not taken place in this period, Camrose County will remedy this brush problem by way of herbicide application.
- Shall advertise annually by way of local newspapers that brush/weed spraying with herbicides will be undertaken along County roads.

- Advertising take place over a period of three consecutive weeks prior to commencement of spraying. (i.e. three weeks prior to June 1st of each year).
- Agreements will only be accepted prior to June 1st of each year.
 - Brush shall be considered controlled if: it is mowed or mechanically removed or controlled by any method so as not to pose a problem to the efficient flow of traffic or to the maintenance of the roadway.
- Weeds shall be considered controlled if: vegetative growth is mechanically removed or they are managed so as to prevent seed set or vegetative propagation.
- Reserves the right to refuse to enter into this agreement with any landowner/tenant.
- Shall make this agreement available on a yearly basis with the landowner/tenant.

LANDOWNER/TENANT RESPONSIBILITIES

- Shall sign and deliver to the Agricultural Fieldman, a copy of this agreement before June 1st of each year.
- Agree to control all brush/weeds to the satisfaction of the Agricultural Fieldman and the Manager of Public Works.
- Agree that if the landowner/tenant cannot meet the commitments of good brush/weed control, will let the Agricultural Service Board staff spray the brush/weeds with herbicides as required.
- Agree to advise the Agricultural Fieldman if the location of the Spraying Exempt Areas change from year to year.
