- 2. Lloyd moved that the minutes of the Nov 17<sup>th</sup>, 2010 meeting be adopted as presented **CARRIED** 
  - A get well gift discussion for Eileen Chauvet and her condition was reviewed
- **3.** Order of Resolution presentation was discussed: Order will be: Maureen, Gary, Lloyd, Joe, Mary Anne, Soren
  - Noted that a 3/5 majority be required for Resolution #5 (Environmental Regulations on Crown Land)
  - Discussion on the Emergent Resolutions took place.

#### i) Emergent Resolution #1

- Does not meet criteria for an emergent resolution
- Is not under rule 4E an Emergency of Provincial significance
- If the sponsoring municipality wishes to meet with committee to speak to the resolution Geoff will discuss that with them
- A 3/5 majority is required if they choose to bring the Resolution forward from the floor.

## Joe moved to ACCEPT Emergent Resolution #1 "Return the use of rendering industry for dead livestock removal" DEFEATED

#### ii) Emergent Resolution #2

- Is emergent in nature as the Bill is to be passed soon in Parliament
- Bill c544 is item that changed since Regional Conferences
- Requires 3/5 the majority to be accepted as emergent

#### 5. Discussion items for meeting with Minister Jack Hayden

#### 5.1 Pat - introductions & opening comments

- Thank you for support of the 2007 Tax Code Amendment resolution
- Merle Goode, Brian Brewin and Jeremy Robinson met and made recommendations to Minister
- Minister responded very positively to recommendations
- Sharing recommendations with counterparts
- Pat to ask for any other comments from Minister how to push forward to Feds

#### 5.3 SRD Wildlife Fencing Report - Mary Ann

- Remind Minister that the report still hasn't been received
- Acknowledge that the request has been received and the Committee is still waiting for the report
- Some of material is being overused and needs to be replaced
- Elk are becoming a bigger problem further south
- Not enough fencing material was being received in some areas
- Timeliness of receiving product is part of the issue
- Mention it and request SRD report bring to the attention of the Minister
- Ask if there is a need to lobby directly to SRD

Emergency registration of 2% liquid strychnine for 2011

#### 5.5 General awareness - Soren

- Clubroot resolution general awareness and education for producers
- Also talk regarding Fusarium Action Committee (FAC) and having AAAF remain at the table
- Highlight BMP for fusarium and clubroom
- Tie into AFSC and premiums for crop insurance testing and treating
- Make it mandatory for fusarium testing at seed cleaning plants for both mobile and co-ops
- Committee wants zero tolerance

- Communication from ARD employees
  - Hard to have consultation when information is not provided ahead of time
  - o Do better job of communication both ways
- AAAF information circulated earlier
  - o Fusarium Action Committee (FAC)
  - o AAAF feels like they are getting shuffled off to the side
  - Commodity groups have indicated they don't want AAAF at the table getting some push back
  - o ARD wants AAAF at the table
  - o Fieldmen need to remain at the table
    - ➤ 1 vote good, but they need to allow other fieldmen to offer information and direct the vote
    - ➤ AAAF Pest committee decides who is voting member
    - ➤ Regions choose person to sit on Pest Committee and then the pest committee chooses representative
    - ➤ Pest Committee meeting this afternoon
- Mistrust between the committee members of the FAC
- Important that AAAF remain strong at those meetings and a strong chairman is important when dealing with issues with industry
- AAMD&C could chair the committee so that it is politicians talking to politicians
- AAAF also needs to have policies and represent one viewpoint
- There is a strong message that ARD is not pushing AAAF away;
   commodity groups are pushing AAAF away from table
- Commodity groups want debate coming from one person

#### 5.7 AESA/ASB Grant Integration - Geoff

- There was lots of concern how the Environmental Stream Funding was allocated
- Would have been better if divvied up equally
- Performance didn't count into the formula; there was no consideration of history
- Let people work as groups
- Concern is: merit based approach wasn't really followed
- Ask if this can be revisited in a year and make changes at that time
- Asking for input from ASBs and take to Extension Committee to make changes at that time
- Try to make changes in a year or so

- Four recommendations going forward to Minister
  - o Doesn't jeopardize zero percent tolerance with seed
