Primary

- Climate Change and Greenhouse Gas Mitigation
 - Reduce the industry impact on...
 - greenhouse gas emissions and contributions to climate change
 - includes soil quality as it relates to
 - carbon sequestration, and
 - links to climate change and ag GHG mitigation

- Adaptation to Climate Change
- Water Quality
- Soil Quality

Goals:

Primary, Secondary, Tertiary

Tertiary Goals

- Biodiversity Improvements
- Air Quality

Funding:

- Extension projects 75% grant
- Data Collection projects 90% grant
- Applied Research projects 75% grant
- Capital projects 20% grant
- Max \$500,000/group over 5 years

Projects should be...

- Achievable, Focused, Measureable
- Cover significant Scope
 - area, demographics, commodities
- Anticipate a wide variety of projects

Process

- Merit-based
- Application and Proposal
- Review Committee
- At least two intakes per year
 - 1st intake
 - April 3 to May 1, 2018
 - 2nd intake
 - May 2 to August 1, 2018
 - 3rd intake
 - Aug 2 to January 31, 2019
