Not all Flowers are Friendly

White Cockle

Silene pratensis/ Lychnisalba



Identification

- five white, deeply notched flower petals, prominent oval leaves with sticky hairs
- flowers open in the evening

Biology

- annual, biennial or short-lived perennial from Europe
- it has a taproot up to 1.2 metre deep
- it is invasive in nature and reproduces by seed only

Control

- monitor your property regularly, control plants early
- use weed-free soil, gravel and wood chips when landscaping

- handpicking and mowing can work, must be done repeatedly
- if using an approved herbicide, always apply as per the label instructions

Commonly found

- cultivated crops and hay fields
- pastures
- gardens and flower beds

Quick facts

- an individual plant may produce over 24,000 seeds
- seeds are viable two to three weeks after pollination
- particularly difficult to control in alfalfa fields
