




Alberta has the second highest number of farm operators in Canada, behind Ontario.










#### Single Farm Operator and Multiple Farm Operator








Alberta: 40.3 per cent were on single operator farms, and 59.7 per cent were on farms with two or more operators.

#### Paid Farm Work - Year Round and Seasonal or Temporary

- 2015: 9,565 farms (23.5 per cent of all farms) reported having a total of 33,498 year-round, seasonal, or temporary employees.


- Of total employees, 50.3 per cent were seasonal or temporary, while 49.7 per cent were year-round (full or part-time).


