## County of Newell No. 4 By-law No. 1013-90

A By-law of the County of Newell No. 4, in the Province of Alberta, to control Dodder.

Whereas, Dodder is not classified as a weed under the regulation of the Weed Control Act of Alberta, and there is no way at present that a land owner can be compelled to control this parasite plant when found on his property

And, whereas, this plant has made its' appearance in a seed alfalfa field in the County of Newell No. 4

And, whereas, this plant is extremely aggressive, difficult to control, can be spread quickly by contaminated equipment, and can leave a seed residue in the soil that remains viable for many years

And, whereas, the Agricultural Service Board of the County of Newell No. 4, is empowered to recommend to Council that certain weeds be relegated to the status of Restricted Weeds

Therefore, the Council of the County of Newell No. 4 enacts as follows: that Dodder (Cusuta Gronovii Willd) be designated a Restricted Weed within the County of Newell No. 4.
