

- ☑ The Green Certificate Program is recognized by Alberta Learning as two 5-credit training periods, and one 6-credit training period.
- ☑ For each of the three training periods (X, Y, Z), the Trainee's progress, ability and knowledge is monitored by their On-Farm Trainer, and assessed by a Green Certificate Regional Tester.
- ☑ During each of the three training period's testing events, the Trainee is asked to explain and perform five random skills by the Regional Tester.
- Competence in the training period is achieved when the Regional Tester certifies that the trainee's ability and knowledge meets the industry requirements.
- ☑ If the trainee is not successful in any of the five skills, they have opportunity to return to their training farm, brush up on their skill level, and return to another regional testing event to try again, without any academic penalty.

Cattle Health Maintenance

- ☑ Demonstrate basic knowledge of animal physiology and anatomy & common health disorders
- ☑ Perform basic animal first aid
- ☑ Interpret drug labels and administer treatments
- ☑ Apply internal and external pest control materials
- ☑ Monitor cattle during calving and perform postcalving routine
- ☑ Judge cattle for culling and breeding
- ☑ Know basics of current beef quality assurance programs and beef food safety issues
- Understand cattle growth stimulants and their usage (Optional)

Cattle Handling Techniques

- ☑ Demonstrate a basic knowledge of cattle behavior
- ☑ Identify sick or problem cattle

Cattle Feeding Operations

Farm Tractor and Truck Operations

 - trucks & tractors with equipment in tow
 - two axle farm truck
 - three axle farm truck (Optional)

General Farm Equipment Operations
